Pro Boxer of the Year



Shakur Stevenson, who won a Silver Medal in the 2016 Olympic Games. As a Pro he is 12-0 and is the WBO's #1 contender in the Featherweight Class.

Stevenson had a very successful career at the Youth Level, winning the 2014 AIBA Youth World Championships and 2014 Summer Youth Olympics. In 2015 he won the Senior U.S. Olympic Trials, thus qualifying for the U.S. boxing team at the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. In Rio, Stevenson won a silver medal, and was the highest-medaling male for the USA (Claressa Shields won gold on the women's side).

As a Pro he holds the following titles: * IBF Inter-Continental featherweight title

- * WBC Continental Americas featherweight title
- * WBO NABO featherweight title

Ring #44 Boxing Hall of Fame: Buffalo VBA Ring 44 announces its 2019 Buffalo Boxing Hall of Fame inductees.

The six new Hall of Fame members to be inducted at Ring 44's 23rd annual Dinner and awards ceremony are:

Paul Marinaccio: Buffalo, NY native. Had a 25-6-3 professional record from 2002-2014. Fought top heavyweight contenders, Michael Grant, Timur Ibragimov, Chris Byrd and Tony Thompson. Donated much of his purses to battle ALS.

Charlie Pinto*: Buffalo, NY. Had a 32-42-21 from 1922 to 1930 fighting many of the top bantam and featherweights in the country. Later he was a trainer and then a matchmaker for Dewey Michael's Fairview A.C. that held many shows in the 1940's and 50's.

Billy Nichy*: Buffalo, NY. Fought professionally as a light heavyweight from 1932-1945 with a 51-28-2 record. In 1939 he beat undefeated and Buffalo's top light heavyweight prospect Rudy Stiller. Stiller never fought again. In 1942 he fought Jackie Conn of Pittsburgh, brother of champion Billy Conn. Conn would not fight again after the thrashing from Nichy.

The N.J. Boxing Hall of Fame

Ralph Racine: Racine was lightweight from Niagara Falls, Ontario but came to Singers Gym to train in the late 1960's under the tutelage of Johnny Sudac and Charlie Ferraro. He won the 119 lb Open Buffalo Golden Gloves in 1973. He had a pro record of 28-9-1 from 1975-1980. He was rated in the top 15 in the world at one time and lost a close decision to future champ Hilmer Kenty even though he knocked Kenty down.

Andy Sciandra: Buffalo. Amateur boxer. 1983 Jr. Olympics, 1985 United States Jr. Super-heavy weight Champion (Fought in the Jr. world's in Romania, placed 4th). 4 straight NYS Golden Gloves 88-91,3 Northeast Super-heavyweight titles 1985 Ranked #10 in the United States for winning the Junior's 1991 Ranked #3 (winning the Bronze) in the United States Championship's 1992 Ranked #5, Placed fifth in the United States Championship 5 Medals from the Empire State games, including 2 golds 1985, 1986, 2000 Niagara district super heavyweight champion 1987 Steel city super heavyweight champion

Vernon McGriff: Buffalo native. McGriff had an outstanding amateur career winning several Empire State Game medals (Gold '82, 84 and 85) and also Golden Gloves titles (Gold '83 Outstanding boxer). He competed in many national (silver '84 Olympic Festival) and international tournaments (Goodwill games in Moscow).
